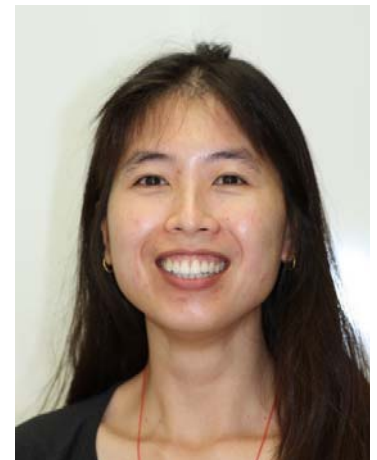
President's Message – A New Year

We are excited about the programs that we have planned: three 1-hour workshops, four 3-hour seminars, and one full-day seminar. The tentative workshop topics include Success in GSA Schedule Contracting, Changes Clauses, and Commercial Contracts - UCC; the tentative seminar topics include Termination, Cost Reimbursement, TINA & Sole Source (joint event with Association of Government Accounting), Intellectual Property, and the all-day Role of the Contract Manager within the Enterprise. There will be a nominal fee to attend each event, with on-line registration linked from the e-mail announcement prior to each.

The seminars generate revenue for the Chapter whereby we can provide other events at no cost to our members including the Contract Administrators' Round Table (CART), NCMA Webinars and a Virtual Conference, study materials, social events, membership recognition, and the scholarship program. This year, CART has expanded to two sessions, one hosted by KES in Kearny Mesa on the 2nd Wednesday of the month and another hosted by ViaSat in Carlsbad on the 4th Wednesday of the month. Watch for time and location announcements.

World Congress – A Personal Perspective

By the time you read this article in our September newsletter, you will probably have heard a lot about the 2011 NCMA World Congress (WC) that was held in Denver, CO in July. Rather than repeating information readily available on the NCMA website, Magazine and email distributions, I would like to offer a personal perspective on how the WC helped me and also our local Chapter.

The first time I attended the WC was in 2009 in Long Beach, CA. In 2009, after the general sessions, I attended six breakout sessions, all covering the same topic: CCCM Fast Track. After I sat through the fast track courses, I took the CCCM and CFCM exam on the third day at the WC.

In Denver, I was able to enjoy other breakout sessions that I had missed during the 2009 WC. My personal favorite was the Property course by Doug Goetz. He is an entertaining speaker and his presentation is extremely informative. I always learn something new in Doug's classes.

The speakers for another session that I attended, INCOTERMS 2010, were the same speakers that taught the CCCM Fast Track in 2009. The instructors, Allen Anderson & Jeffrey Roth, were pleased to hear that I had passed the CCCM exam after attending their session and that I did so without needing any additional study. Personally, I rarely deal with international commercial contracts, but I still attended in order to keep up to date on the topic.

Of course, at any gathering of like-minded professionals, the WC is a great opportunity to meet up with old friends and to establish new connections—I would encourage anyone from the local chapter to attend if possible.

Membership Focus – Meet Lee Davis

Lee is the Membership Director of the San Diego Chapter of NCMA. Lee first joined NCMA while a student at the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California in 1996.

He is currently working as the GWAC SR Contracts Manager for Salient Federal Solutions, Inc. (Salient), a leading provider of information technology, engineering and intelligence analysis services to agencies in the intelligence, defense, homeland security, and cyber domains. Lee served as an independent Contract Management Consultant to Salient prior to joining them permanently in June 2011. He was the former VP, Director of Contracts for SkillStorm Inc., dba SGIS, which was acquired by Salient in June 2010. At SGIS Lee built and led a 10 person department in the execution of over 200 Government and Commercial contracts valued at more than \$100 million annually and led the development of cost proposals resulting in 80% revenue growth.



In 2007, Lee retired as a Supply Corps Commander from the US Navy after serving over 21 years on active duty. His last assignment in the Navy was as the Director of Contracts, NAVSUP Fleet Logistics Center San Diego (formerly Fleet and Industrial Supply Center, San Diego). As such, he was responsible for directing and managing the material and services procurement for over 300 activities nationwide. His department and personnel completed over 10,000 procurement transactions valued at more than \$600 million annually. While on active duty, he also served as the Deputy PCO for the Navy Marine Corps Intranet (NMCI) program as well as the Business Financial Manager (BFM) for the Marine Corps Huey/Cobra Helicopter Upgrades program. He served on multiple sea going platforms in both the surface and submarine community. Lee was fortunate enough during his career to be stationed in Hawaii (twice), Monterey, Italy and San Diego.

Lee has a BSBA from the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, an MS in Acquisition and Contract Management from the Naval Postgraduate School and an MS in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College. He is a Certified Professional Contracts Manager (CPCM) and DAWIA Level III qualified as well.

Lee is married to Heather Carr-Davis and they have lived in San Diego since 2000. They are looking forward to their empty nest as they have recently sent children off to UC Berkeley and CalPoly San Luis Obispo.

There are 3 different certifications that are available in the NCMA Professional Certification Program: the Certified Federal Contracts Manager (CFCM), the Certified Commercial Contracts Manager (CCCM) and the Certified Professional Contracts Manager (CPCM). The CFCM, CCCM and CPCM are certifications awarded to candidates who meet rigorous standards, including experience, education, training and knowledge.

A CFCM certification validates your education, training, experience and your knowledge of the Federal Acquisition Regulation. A CCCM certification validates your education, training, experience and your knowledge of the Uniform Commercial Code. A CPCM certification demonstrates that you have met NCMA's highest standards for education, training, and experience, and have demonstrated your knowledge of the contract management competencies in the Contract Management Body of Knowledge.

So how does one go about getting certified? The first step is to research the different Certifications available and determine which one you would like to pursue. Information describing each Certification and its fulfillment requirements is available at www.ncmahq.org/GetCertified. Once you have determined which Certification you would like to pursue, the next step is to understand the fulfillment requirements for completing the Certification. The next step would be determining the time and expense involved in completing. There are funds available through your local NCMA Chapter to reimburse those who complete Certification exams. You should check with your employer as well as many cover this expense. The NCMA SD Chapter also has the study materials for each Certification that can be loaned on a first come, first served basis. The final step of course is to commit to Certification and do it!

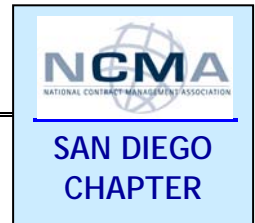
